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ANCIENT THRACE IN THE ROMAN IMPERIAL SYSTEM (1ST – 3RD CENTURY AD)

The establishment of the Roman provinces of Moesia (ca. AD 15) and Thracia (ca. AD 47) put an end to a long and bloody process of Rome conquering the Thracian lands in the eastern part of the Balkan peninsula. However, these achievements were followed by often changes of the provincial borders, clearly indicating the need for an adequate adjustment to the local context. Within the Roman provinces, a transformation of Thracian society and its cultural milieu took place, still allowing the further development of some remarkable Thracian cultural phenomena from the pre-Roman period.
